Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to a new school year - I hope you all had a peaceful and restful holiday! We were pleased to see that the children have returned to school safe and well and have obviously enjoyed their long break! All our children look superb in their school uniform and in particular, those wearing their new smart ties which school has given out to all Year 6 children. A special warm welcome to all our new parents and children. We hope you enjoy a long and happy association with Featherstone and that your children will succeed to the very best of their ability during their time at our school.

This year, we have introduced a number of new aspects to the school curriculum. A glimpse of some of these include:

**Phonics (Read, Write, Inc.):** We have reviewed our current scheme on the teaching of phonics and have launched a new scheme called 'Read, Write, Inc'. Miss. Lacey has worked exceptionally hard in setting this up and will send further information explaining all this in the English Newsletter.

**Reading in school:** We are passionate about reading and that every child must be able to read before leaving school. We believe that if you can read, you can do anything! It's also important that children hear what good reading is and as part of the school day, to share our love of reading and provide additional models for the children, they will be read to at the end of the school day by members of staff.

**100 Book Challenge**: Last year, we introduced a goal to encourage every child to read 100 books before leaving their primary school. This year, we need a real push from our parents to make this even more of a success. Please see the list that has been sent out so that you can continue to make sure that your child gets to read all the books that have been selected for their year.

**Homework:** Homework plays an important part of school life but importantly it needs to be manageable, fun and engaging for parents too. For a number of years, we have listened to parents' and children's views and have made vast changes in the way forward. Further information regarding homework will be sent to you over the next week so watch this space.

**Real life experiences (trips):** To make our school curriculum even more engaging and fun, we are extending this further outside the walls of the classroom. We will be using our mini-bus and taking the children out to local venues. Some of these will include: museums, parks and libraries etc. There will be no extra cost to parents for these visits.

**Maths:** This year, children in Year 4 will be tested on multiplication (times tables) and it's important that they develop rapid recall skills. Miss. Whitehouse will continue to promote 'Rock Star Maths' and 'Mythical Maths' so that children's confidence in maths skills develops.

Language Functions: Last term, we asked for you to complete a short questionnaire regarding spoken language at home. Thank you for completing this questionnaire. As a result of this, we have now developed a new approach within lessons to further develop children's spoken language and improve the quality of talk, through a planned structured approach. We aim to provide opportunities for the children to use new language and expand their vocabulary; as a result, we hope this will help children to be more able writers.

#### Behaviour in School.

As you know, behaviour in our school is monitored by all staff and we have regular training for staff in this area. It's always important for parents to know how we monitor this and log information. Children's behaviour in class is closely monitored. Where children's behaviour is good, this is acknowledged and rewarded. The children are given house points, Marvellous Me texts sent home and enrichment time on Friday. However they need to earn this, as it's not a given right! When there are concerns regarding a child's behaviour, parents are informed. In the first instance, this is raised by the class teacher directly with you. Class teachers log all information regarding behaviour using internal systems, so that there is continuous monitoring to identify any patterns of behaviour or ongoing concerns. Behaviour at Featherstone is excellent and with parental support, we can maintain this.

#### **Bullying Concerns and Online monitoring.**

All staff closely monitor signs of bullying in school and any rare incidents of bullying are stamped out mediately. In the event of any incidents of bullying, teachers rapidly address this through class discussions and educating the children by encouraging positive relationships and the use of strategies to resolve or defuse issues.



All staff (teachers, teaching assistants and dinner staff) are trained to spot signs of bullying (including e-safety). At Featherstone Primary, we have an e-safety monitoring system which allows for all internet usage in school to be monitored. Any pages visited by the user which are inappropriate are immediately flagged and this is then followed through by designated people. In most cases, we have found that this is usually low level and just requires to give the children a gentle reminder about internet rules. All of our children are aware of this monitoring, know the rules and also how to report any concerns that they may have. Throughout school, posters are visible in corridors and in classrooms so that children know who to go if they have a worry. We have found that our children are exceptionally confident in knowing who to go and talk to if they have a concern, or would just like a chat!

#### Marvellous Me

Marvellous Me tells you about the wonderful things that your child is learning, and pings you when they've been praised for good work or a great character skill. It makes you smile, feel proud, and inspires better home learning support and encouragement. Marvellous Me tells parents what their children are learning across the curriculum. All parents have a log in to receive updates from class teachers in how well their children are doing in class. If you have any difficulties, please ask to speak to Mrs. Wilson.



#### Medication

From time-to-time, your child may need to take prescribed medication which falls during the school day. If this is the case, please complete the medication consent form in the main office. We have designated staff that are certified to administer medication. All medication is kept in a supervised area.

#### Place2Be

Children's emotional and social wellbeing are important if they are to feel happy, safe and confident in themselves as individuals and in their sense of belonging. Ciaran, our Place2Be Manager, has been working with us for a couple of years now and has got to know the children well. Ciaran will now be working with us five days a week. Children in school are able to see Ciaran about any part of their school life by going to 'Place2Talk' as well as counselling sessions too.



At Featherstone Primary School, our parents recognise that educating children is a process that involves partnership between parents, class teachers and the school community. As a partnership, our parents will understand the importance of a good working relationship to equip children with the necessary skills for adulthood. For these reasons, we continue to welcome and encourage parents/carers to participate fully in the life of our school.

#### Parent Code of Conduct. We expect parents, carers and visitors to:

Respect the caring ethos of our school

- Understand that both teachers and parents need to work together for the benefit of their children.
- Demonstrate that **all** members of the school community should be treated with respect and therefore set a good example in their own speech and behaviour.
- Seek to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view in order to bring about a peaceful solution to any issue.
- Correct own child's behaviour especially in public where it could otherwise lead to conflict, aggressive behaviour or unsafe behaviour.
- Approach the school to help resolve any issues of concern.

We have a Zero Tolerance Policy on school grounds. Any parent not complying with this will be asked to leave the school grounds. If we need to take further action through the local authority or police we will not hesitate to do so.

#### Social Media Sites

- The use of social media websites being used inappropriately is unacceptable and not in the best interests of the children or the whole school community.
- Any concerns you may have about the school must be made through the appropriate channels so they can be dealt with fairly, appropriately and effectively for all concerned. Social media must not be used to comment on school matters in negative ways under any circumstances.
- In the event that any pupil or parent/carer of a child/ren being educated in this school is found to be posting offensive or defamatory comments on Facebook or other social network sites, they will be reported to the appropriate 'report abuse' section of the network site and also to the Local Authority.
- <u>In serious cases the school will also consider its legal options to deal with any such misuse of social networking and other sites.</u>

### <u>Celebrating good attendance</u> (96.6% and above)

After the success of the attendance shop last year, we will be continuing to promote attendance in the same way this year. The attendance shop rewards children on a half-termly or termly basis for their attendance in school for that period (except the Summer term where this is based on the full Year). This means that all children have a fresh start each term if they have been unwell or had to miss school due to medical or personal circumstances. The children receive a voucher for attendance above 97% that they can exchange in a pop-up shop for a prize of their choosing. Bonus vouchers are also available for children with improved attendance each term.

At the end of each term (key dates to be announced), every child's attendance will be calculated. If their attendance falls into one of the brackets below, they will be given their **Attendance Shop Voucher** and their class teacher will present them with a certificate.
