Dear Parents/Carers,

I'd like to start this Home School Newsletter with another **Thank You.** The staff and children who have been in school this week have been brilliant, as have the staff who have been working at home, behind the scenes, to ensure that the school continues to operate smoothly in these difficult times.

On Wednesday of this week, you should have received a letter from me that explains what we are going to put into place from the 20th April to help the children with their learning whilst the school remains closed. In summary, four English, four Maths and four Non-core sessions/activities will be sent to you on a Monday morning (these will be links to our school website). Any answers that are needed will then be sent on the next Friday. You won't need any specialist equipment for these lessons and you don't necessarily even have to print them off; if you would like to use them, the children and you just need to see them on a screen. We hope this will help the children in their future learning.

I have also recently written to you regarding keeping children safe whilst they are at home, especially whilst online. Please do keep an eye on what your children are doing whilst they are on the internet. More importantly please remember to put parental locks.

This week, Mr. Douglas has sent out the second set of Free School Meal (FSM) vouchers. These weekly vouchers are to financially help those families who are eligible for FSM from benefits. Each child us entitled to £15 per week. 







Children's Reminder: The Value of the Month






