



What have Year 6 been up to this week?

This week in writing, we continued our genre of brochures. Year 6 planned, edited and created their own brochure based on their own hotel. The focus was on breaking the fourth wall, including exciting description to tempt the reader and using testimonials that are punctuated correctly that encourage the reader to book.



This week in maths, we reflected a variety of different shapes in both the x and y axis while also recapping co-ordinates. Year 6 then moved on to calculating the mean of a given context. In the final two lessons of the week, we interpreted and drew pie charts using the information provided.

In science, we concluded our science topic of living things and their habitats by defining and explaining what microbes are by exploring the three different variations and understanding how they are classified and their function. The children concluded this by presenting their knowledge in a double page spread.

In music, on the keyboards, the children were reading music notes in order to play a piece of music. This varied from nursery rhymes to songs. They then began to practise one song/rhyme they would like to perform in their parent showcase.

In computing, year 6 reflected on their online use by understanding why we use the internet, what responsibilities we have online, potential issues they may encounter and how they can overcome them.

In PE, year 6 continued to develop knowledge and competence in performing a range of basic floor and vault skills.

On Wednesday afternoon, year 6 did a tremendous job during their showcase to parents. They performed three songs, which included using the djembes. The performance was concluded with a variety of children performing a song/rhythm on the keyboard.



Finally, on Thursday evening, some children from Year 6 performed at the CBSO in Birmingham with Anne-Marie Hopper. The children sounded incredible and did the school proud.
