Dear Parents/Carers of Year 2, 3, 4 and 5,

Re: Potential School Re-opening information

The Government has published information for schools, on their intention to have some primary pupils return to school as early as June 1st. This is **only** for children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 6.

There is a great deal of conversation with regards to schools opening and whether schools should be open at all. The Government have decided to open schools and this will be down to school leaders across the country to put this into action to fit around each setting.

The [guidance](#) that has been published advises on a number of things, which includes advice on social distancing in schools, number of pupils in groups, staggered break and lunchtimes as well as drop-off and pick-up points. All this is going to have an impact on school and how we manage this, considering the number of adults that are available for work and those that may be shielding.

The DfE has confirmed there will be no penalty for families who do not send their children back to school, but that families “will be strongly encouraged to take up these places – unless the child or a family member is shielding or the child is particularly vulnerable due to an underlying condition.”

For parents of children in **Year EYFS, Year 1 and 6**, a link will be sent to them to complete a questionnaire so that we know the number of families that are going to be sending their children to school. This is only for those families.

In light of this decision, I also need to make you aware that since the initial closure of the school, we have operated on school grounds full-time and throughout the Easter holiday. Currently, the teaching unions are in consultation with the Government regarding the opening of school on the 1st June, but if this is still to go ahead then in order to ensure that we are fully ready and prepared for this opening, **we will be closed over the May half term holiday period for all children**. I feel that the staff also need the time to have a break ready for a what will be an ‘interesting’ term.

Parents, over the next few days, depending on what guidance comes through, please can you kindly keep an active eye on your emails as you will receive instructions from school on the following:
