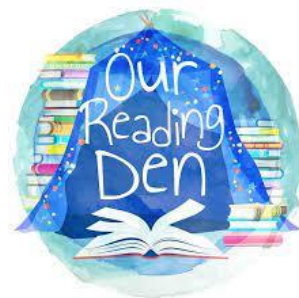

Reading Buddies – organised by Miss. Beach

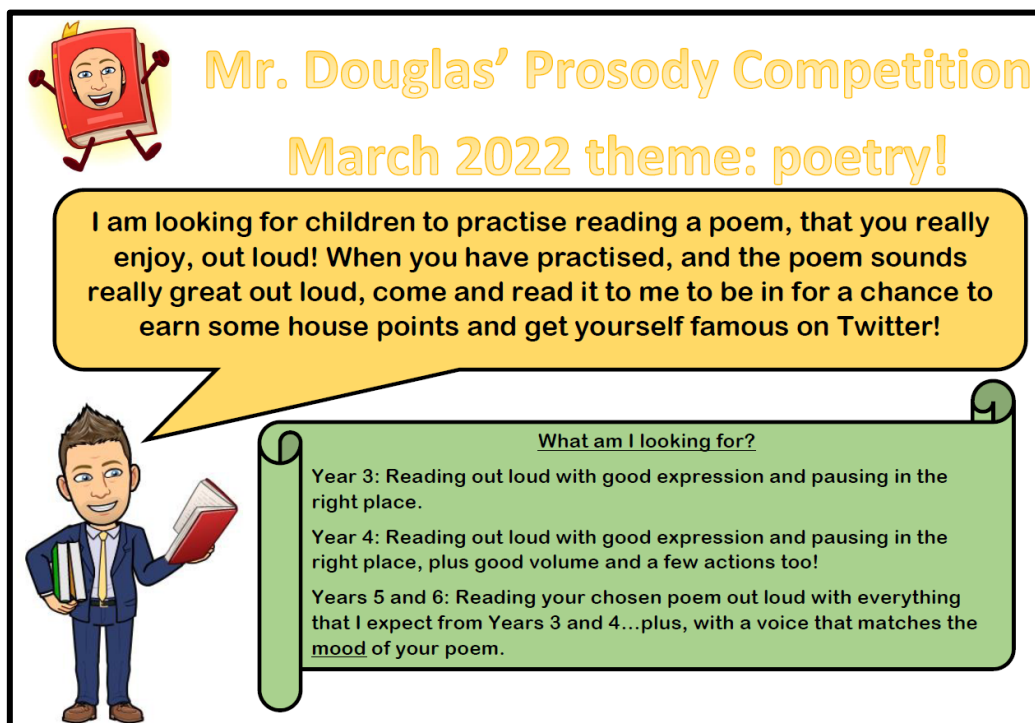

Mr. Douglas' Prosody Competition
March 2022 theme: poetry!

I am looking for children to practise reading a poem, that you really enjoy, out loud! When you have practised, and the poem sounds really great out loud, come and read it to me to be in for a chance to earn some house points and get yourself famous on Twitter!

What am I looking for?

- Year 3: Reading out loud with good expression and pausing in the right place.
- Year 4: Reading out loud with good expression and pausing in the right place, plus good volume and a few actions too!
- Years 5 and 6: Reading your chosen poem out loud with everything that I expect from Years 3 and 4...plus, with a voice that matches the mood of your poem.
