Demolition of the Caretaker's House & New Special Education Needs Hub

I am pleased to inform you that the demolition of the Caretaker's House is complete and ready for the construction of a new, single-storey Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Learning Hub.

This project has been fully budgeted for by the school and is part of our continued commitment to ensuring our pupils have access to high-quality, inclusive learning environments.

All construction and design elements—including planning permission, building conditions, and architectural plans—have been approved and signed off. We are excited to share that the provision has been thoughtfully designed to reflect our long-term vision, ensuring all our pupils continue to thrive.

The new SEND Hub will include:

- A sensory room
- A teaching area
- An open-plan kitchen
- A sensory garden
- Skylight windows for natural light
- Bi-fold doors opening to the garden area

Construction is expected to continue from August 2025 through to April 2026.

Remembrance Day

Pupils attended assemblies where they learnt about the importance of Remembrance Day and why it falls on the 11th November every year and at 11am. We observed a two-minute silence to remember the soldiers, airmen and sailors who fought in wars to help keep us safe.

Across the week, each class have reflected on Remembrance Day in a number of ways including colouring in poppies and exploring a tuff tray with soldiers and poppies, listening to a story about Remembrance Day, writing words and phrases that remind them of peace and kindness, reflecting on things they are thankful for, making a large remembrance wreath from their painted hands (in the style of a poppy) and creating blackout poetry based on the poem, In Flander's Field.











School Trips

We have had lots of exciting trips over the last few weeks!

Year 3 visited the Hindu Temple where they learnt about how Hindus worship. They also learnt about the Hindu Gods such as Ganesh – the elephant-headed God that helps people overcome problems.



Some students in year 4 visited the Sea Life Centre to learn about marine animals and how to protect our oceans from pollution.





Year 5 enjoyed their trip to the National Memorial Arboretum to reflect on and remember all those that took part in WW1.





Some children in year 6 were given the opportunity to visit the Library of Birmingham to explore the Forgotten Generations Exhibition. The children were lucky enough to be toured around by Karen Kellar, one of the founders of the display. The children learnt a vast history in relation to African and Caribbean service men stretching over seven decades.
